SLAYERS OF DEFENCELESS ARE ON TRIAL Full A

Officers of Hun Sub. Which Sank Llandovery Castle Face the Court.

PLEA OF NOT GUILTY IS MADE BY ONE

Claims He Obeyed Commander in Torpedoing Hospital

Leipsec, July 13.—The German submarine lieutenants, Ludwig Dittmar and Johan Boldt, were placed on trial here yesterday in the supreme count tcharged with murder in the first degree for firing on life boats after the torpedoing of the Canadian hospital ship, Llandovery Castle, in the summer of 1918.

The case differs from the others which have been heard by the court in connection with charges growing out of violations of civilized warfare, dnasmuch as the proceedings are on behalf of the German public prosecutor. Great Britain had only demanded the trial of Commander Patisig, of the submarine which torpedoed the hospital ship, who fled the country, but the prosecutor, after examining the evidence, ordered the trial of Dittman and Boldt.

Many Witnesses.
