has completed a statement of the finances of the last exhibition. The receipts from all sources were \$19,440,50 and the total expenditures \$20,804,90, leaving a deficit of \$1,364 35. The income account shows that \$.0,034.65 was realized from admissions at the gates, \$2,043 45 from entrance fees and privileges, and \$2,006.45 from the grand stand and amusement hall. These with the donation of \$300 from the St. John Railway Company and \$56 on the capital stock account comprise the entire income. The sum of \$6,439 60 for prises and judging was expended, against \$5,805 in 1898, \$1,500 less in grants was received.
