

The minister of justice has once more amended his resolution respecting judge's salaries, and now gives notice of it in the following terms: The supreme, superior or exchequer court judges, on resignation, may be granted annuity equal to the salary held at the time of resignation, provided such judge has attained the age of seventy-five years, and has been on the bench of one of these courts as a stipendiary magistrate of the territories for twenty years or upwards, or attained the age of seventy and been on the bench of one of these courts or a stipendiary magistrate in the territories for twenty-five years, or continued in office as judge of these courts for thirty years.

If any judge of the supreme, superior or exchequer courts has resigned to accept a lieutenant-governorship, he may be granted after the expiry of his term an annuity equal to two-thirds of his judicial salary.

Every county court judge who has attained eighty years of age shall be compulsorily retired.
