NOTES AND NEWS.

RELIQUARY.

The Rev. Mr. Wesley, who is to be buried in Westminster Abbey, is nearly completed.

The United Catholic publishes statistics showing that the Roman Catholics in England increased from 60,000 in 1765 to 1,850,000 in 1845.

The Moravian missionary churches in Antigua, West Indies, have received their last century 4,101 adult members and 3,921 boys and girls.

Dispatches from Italy state that the Government does not intend, as reported, to suppress the Catholic societies on account of the recent troubles.

A conference of Anglican bishops is to be held at Lambeth in November to consider the subject of episcopal vestments.

It is also now under consideration by a large committee of the Lower House of the Canterbury Province.

The Bishop of Lincoln will lay before the conference a number of petitions requesting the sanction of a distinctive dress to the administration of the communion.

It will be remembered that the Bishop of Lincoln recently denied the right of Wesleyan ministers to be recognized by the title of Rev. by the Church of England.

The Queen, the Head of the Church, has recently settled the question adversely to the Bishop's view by addressing the President of the Wesleyan Conference, Dr. Pusey, as Reverend, in a letter in reply to the address of the Conference.
