

among the Records of the said Court ; and within                      days after the lapse of other six months a like other duplicate shall be transmitted and remain among the said Records, and so be continued by the said Trustee at the end of every                      months, until the Estate may be finally divided and closed ; and extracts from such writings, signed by a Prothonotary of the aforesaid Court, shall bear evidence in all Courts of Justice and the said Register and the Bankrupt's Books and Papers and the whole other Papers in the Trustees hands shall at all times be made public and be open to the free access of any Creditor who may desire to see the same.

Court &c. to make interim orders in case of Appeals.

XLVIII. And be it further enacted that if any Appeal shall be made from any interlocutory order of any Court having power under this Act to adjudge, and where legally such appeal may be had, it shall be lawful and competent to the Court holding Jurisdiction, to make such orders and direct such Proceedings, notwithstanding any such appeal, as shall appear to be necessary for preventing the Estate of the Debtor from being embezzled, secreted, damaged or lessened, while any such appeal may be pending, and every step may in the mean time be taken in the recovery of the Bankrupt's Estate, and the distribution thereof, that is not repugnant or injurious to the interests which the party appealing by the appeal insists upon.

Every Creditor may join in the petition for sequestration ; and death of a Creditor or of Bankrupt shall not stay proceedings.

XLIX. And be it further enacted that when any Petition for sequestration under the authority of this Act may be presented, it shall be competent for any other Creditor to concur therein, and to follow up and pursue the same even without the consent or after the death of the Creditor or Creditors originally petitioning, and the expence therein shall be disbursed and repaid by the Trustee out of the first monies that comes into his hands ; and if the Bankrupt shall happen to die during any such Proceedings under this Act, the same may and shall lawfully be carried on and pursued as if the said Bankrupt were living, any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.
