Is *Lieut. Col.* 7th Batt. Huntingdon Militia. Sat for present seat in L.A., Can., from 1863 until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. E. Cartier.—*Montreal.*

POPE, *Major JOHN HENRY, J.P.* [*Compton.*]

Commanded the Cookshire Volunteer Cavalry for many years. Is President of the St. Francis and Megantic International Railway, and of the Compton Colonization Society, one of the Trustees of St. Francis College, Richmond, P.Q., and a Director of the Eastern Townships Bank. Sat for present seat in L. A., Can., from 1857, until the Union. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same seat at g. e. 1854. Returned to Commons by acclamation at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of the present Administration.—*Cookshire, Q.*

POULIOT, *BARTHÉLÉMY, J.P.* [*L'Islet.*]

S. of M. Berthélémy Pouliot, merchant, by Louise Blais. B. in St. Jean d'Orléans, P.Q., 15 Oct., 1811. Ed. in Quebec. M. Miss M. Fraser. Is a merchant, and a Commissioner for the trial of Small Causes. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat, but unseated on petition in 1869, when new election and he was again returned. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. E. Cartier.—*L'Islet, P.Q.*
