

nor less than currency, to be levied as herein-after is provided; and in case it shall appear to such Churchwarden or Churchwardens that such person or persons, keeping a house or other place of public entertainment, as aforesaid, Hawker, Pedlar, or Petty Chapman, have not a licence, as by Law required, it shall be incumbent on him and them to sue the delinquent or delinquents, as provided by an Act made and passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of his late Majesty George the Third, chapter eighty-eight, and by a certain other Act passed by the Legislature of this Province, in the thirty-fifth year of the reign of his late Majesty aforesaid, chapter eight.

VI. And whereas, in order the better to fulfil the purposes of this Act, it is expedient to authorise and require the Churchwardens in the several Parishes in this Province, to enforce on Sundays, the provisions of a certain Act made and passed in the forty-fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled, "An Act to prohibit the sale of goods, wares and merchandise, wine, spirits and other strong liquors on Sundays." Be it therefore further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of each and every of the Churchwardens in office, and of the Churchwarden last gone out of office, of every Parish, to enforce the due observance of the said Act during all Sundays, within their Parishes respectively, and to sue and recover each and every penalty, for any infraction or infractions of the said Act, which hereafter shall or may come within their knowledge respectively.

VII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of each and every of the Churchwardens as aforesaid, to cause to be arrested and carried before any one of the nearest of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, all and every person or persons which he or they may find during any Sunday or Holiday, during Divine Service, loitering or tippling in any House of Public Entertainment or in any place of public resort, whether within doors or in the open air, where any ale, wine, spirits or strong drink may be sold or distributed on a Sunday or Holiday, during Divine Service as aforesaid, within the limits of their Parishes respectively, and also each and every person whom they may find cursing and swearing or provoking to fight, drunk, or using violence in the streets, highways or
