

AMERICAN TIMBER.

RETURN to an Address of The Honourable House of Commons, to His Majesty, dated the 6th of June 1820:—for,

AN ACCOUNT OF ALL THE RAFTS OF TIMBER CUT WITHIN THE AMERICAN LINES,

That have passed the fort of St. John's on Lake Champlain, on their way to Quebec by the river Sorel, between the Years 1800 and 1820; specifying their Contents, and whether composed of Spars for Masts, White and Red Pine, or Oak:

Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant General The Earl of Dalhousie, G.C.B. to the Earl Bathurst, K.G. dated 29 November 1820;—inclosing,

- (1.)—An Account of the various Kinds of Timber exported from the port of Quebec in the Years 1800 to 1820 inclusive.
- (2.)—A Statement of the number of Rafts of Timber, and their Contents, imported into the province of Lower Canada from Lake Champlain in the United States of America, and entered at the port of St. John's, from the Year 1800 to 1820 inclusive.
- (3.)—Return of Timber of all descriptions which has been imported into Lower Canada from the United States of America, as entered at the port of Côteau-du-Lac, between the 16th June 1825 and 3d September 1820.
