

93. Any person who shall unlawfully dispose of or remove any arms, accoutrements, or other articles belonging to the Crown, or refuse to deliver up the same in his possession, except for lawful cause, the proof of which shall lie upon him, shall thereby incur a penalty of five pounds for each offence—but this shall not prevent such offender from being indicted and punished for any greater offence, if the facts amount to such, instead of being subjected to the penalty aforesaid; and any person charged with any act subjecting him to the penalty imposed by this section, may be arrested by order of the Magistrate before whom the complaint is made, upon affidavit, showing that there is reason to believe that such person is about to leave the Province, carrying any such arms, accoutrements, or articles with him.

Unlawfully disposing of arms.

94. Any officer or man of a Volunteer Militia Company who, when such Company shall be lawfully called upon to act in aid of the civil power, shall refuse or neglect to go out with such Company, or to obey any lawful order of his superior officer, or any Magistrate, shall thereby incur a penalty of five pounds for each such offence.

Refusing to turn out, &c.

98. Any person who shall wilfully contravene any enactment of this Act, when no other penalty is imposed for such contravention, shall thereby incur a penalty of five pounds for each offence—but this shall not prevent his being indicted and punished for any greater offence, if the facts amount to such.
