C A P. XXXVIII.

An Act to enable His Majesty to make Regulations with respect to the taking and curing Fish on certain Parts of the Coasts of Newfoundland, Labrador, and His Majesty's other Possessions in North America, according to a Convention made between His Majesty and the United States of [14th June 1819.] America.

THEREAS a Convention between His Majesty and the Convention. United States of America, was made and signed at London, dated 20th on the Twentieth Day of October One thousand eight hun. Oct. 1818. dred and eighteen; and by the First Article of the said Convention, reciting that Differences had arisen respecting the Liberty claimed by the United States for the Inhabitants thereof to take, dry, and cure Fish in certain Coasts, Bays, Harbours, and Creeks of His Britannic Majesty's Dominions in America, it is agreed, that the Inhabitants of the said United States shall have for ever, in common with the Subjects of His Britannic Majesty, the Liberty to take Fish of every Kind on that Part of the Southern Coast of Newfoundland which extends from Cape Ray to the Rameau Islands, on the Western and Northern Coasts of Newfoundland, from the said Cape Ray to the Quirpon Islands, on the Shores of the Magdalen Islands, and also on the Coasts, Bays, Harbours, and Creeks from Mount Joly on the Southern Coasts of Labrador, to and through the Straits of Belleisle, and thence northwardly indefinitely along the Coast, without Prejudice however to any of the exclusive Rights of the Hudson's Bay Company; and it was also by the said Article of the said Convention
