The maid of honor was gowned in a pale yellow ensemble and the bridesmaid were dressed alike in apricot.

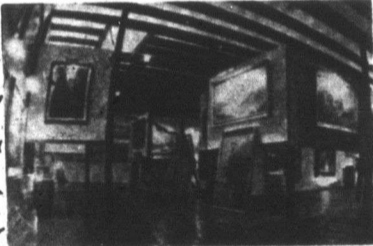
Best man was Ross McMillan of Streetsville and ushers included Ivan Tait,
