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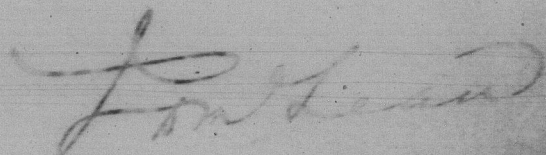
Ottawa, November 25th, 1913.

Sir,

Referring to that paragraph of your report of the 14th instant stating that the Councillor of Poylar River Band asked for an O.C. I beg to state that this Band has already been supplied with more cattle than it is entitled to by Treaty and they have neglected to take care of them with the result that the report of your predecessor shows that they have no more live stock at hand.

As you are aware these Indians are only entitled to the time from the Reserve, hunting and fishing, but if you can advise the Department that an O.C. would be useful to them and they would take care of the animal the question of supplying the Band would be for consideration.
