- A. (con't) could be of some help to the war, and help at home. After I got through basic training, things got tough at home, my people tried to get me out because I was under age when I joined up.
- Q. Tell the court what happened after you completed your basic training, did you immediately proceed to an advanced training centre?
- A. No, I didn't, I had a bit of trouble at Gornwall,
  I was held over in another platoon doing fatigue
  work.
- Q. After you left there were you sent to an advanced training dentre?
- A. It was after that I went to Ottawa where, the Adjutant at Cornwall, told me I was to be discharged.
- Q. How long were you in Ottawa?
- A. Approximately four months.
- Q. While there did you take training?
- A. No, Sir, I was on fatigues.
- Q. Where did you go after leaving Ottawa?
- A. Well, Sir, one evening they told us we were going on draft, we were sent to Camp Ipperwash.
- Q. For what purpose?
- A. Advanced training.
- Q. Did you take advanced training at Camp Ipperwash?
- A. I got there and started training and I was sent to Chatham for basic training.
- Q. Did you take your training at No. 12 U.I.(3) T.U., at Chathan?
- A. No, I didn't.
- Q. Was there anything else bothering you at that time?
- A. Yes, there was trouble.... getting back to Ottawa, which happened while I was in Ottawa.
