- Q.149 How do you know that it did?

- Q.150 It is true that the last time you saw Mr. Corbett on Christmas Eve was in the room with Miss Crouch and Col. Coombs and the next time you saw Mr. Corbett was when he came into room No. 4 the next morning. You didn't see him in between those times did you?
- A.150 No.

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Questioned by the Court

- Q.151 When you went back to the Mess the second time could you tell us the number of drinks you had?
- A.151 I don't know.
- Q.152 It would be less than twenty?
- A.152 Yes.
- Q.153 Was it more than ten?
- A.153 I don't know.
- Q.154 It might have been ten?
- A.154 Yes.
- Q.155 Could you say it was more than half a dozen definitely?
- A.155 I couldn't say, I haven't any idea.
- Q.156 Your whole evidence is given to the best of your recollection?
- A.156 Yes.
- Q.157 Do you think that your recollection of the events of that evening after you left the Mess the last time are absolutely accurate,
- A.157 I've told you as I remember.
- Q.158 You don't think it was clear?
- A.158 No, not after that time.
- Q.159 Your recollection then is hazy?
- A.159 Yes.
- Q.160 In that case, if somebody came in and swore definitely on oath as to any event which took place after you left the Mess that evening for the last time, would you feel that you were in a position to contradict definitely?
- A.160 I know we went to Orchard House.
- Q.161 Supposing that someone swore definitely for example that Col. Coombs had not gone to Orchard House with you, would you be in a position to swear definitely that he had?
- A.161 I definitely remember him with me in the bath-room.
