River was already included in Reserve No. 3 and the other feature of this application was the Industrial School site, a strictly departmental matter. The opplication for Giayak was for Land already covered by Timber Limit with the exception of two small reserves belonging to the Tanockteuch Bend. As for the application for Zuntdak-iya, on Cracroft Island, this was a rocky place which could never be of any use to anyone, for which reason he declined to endorse the application. On Aglahuma, or Plawateis Island, he recommended that 60 or WO mores be granted if svailable, as he thought it was, also the small island on the west containing the old Indian Village site. The land covered by the application for Waskita, on Herdy Bay, was shown on the blue print to be all Crown Granted, and for this reason the application was now endorsed. As to the land esked for at Waki-da-tai, on the Rastern side of Lagoon Cove. Gracroft Island, some of it was apparently open, although Lot 53 was evidently an old surveyed Grown Grant, judging from the number given it. A channel ran through it that was navigable for cances at high water, and it also contained a good clam beach. This was seemingly alienated, for which reason the application could not be recommended. The next application was for I-gie- da-lis. on Baronot Passage. All the peninsula there was apparently under Pulp Lease No. 500, but the Indians had had an old village there twenty one years age and used the place every year during the fishing season. He recommended that ten acres be granted, taking in the Indian houses" and described as on the north shore of Baronet Passage close to Blackney Pass -- on the peninsula between Parson's Bay and Blackney Pass. These Indian houses had been the in continuous use for many years. The .187 location recommended was almost at the eastern end of the peninsula, and the place would be used as a halibut
