UNIVERSITY OF BISHOP'S & COLLEGE

FACULTY OF MEDICINE session of 1884-85.

HE FOURTEESTH WINTER SESSION of this Faculty will open a on the first Tuesday in October, 1884. The Faculty of Medicine of Bishop's College bases its claim for public support upon the theroughly practical character of its instruction, and the fact that the means at its disposal for this purpose are not excelled by any medical school in Canada.

Its Diploma is recognized by the Royal College of Physicians, Edinburgh ; the Royal College of Surgeons, England ; and the Royal College of Physicians, London. Students have the option of attending the practice of either the Montreal General Hospital (200 beds), or of the Hotel Dien H spital (200 beds), both of which institutions have a staff who regularly and systematically visit them. At the Montreal General Hospital excellent facilities are afforded for the study of Practical Pathology, under the direction of the Pathologist of the Hospital. The practice of the Montreal Dispensary—where spendid opportunity is afforded to learn Dispensing—is open to the Students of Dishops College.

The WOMAN'S DEPARTMENT OF THE WESTEIN HOSPITAL, under the supervision of this Faculty, is divided into two departments—Obstetrical and Gynecological. The Obstetrical Department is under the control of the Professor of Midwifery, and affords to Students a field unequalled in the Dominion—in fact this Department has made Bishop's College the Midwifery School of Canada. The Gynecological Department is attended by the Professors of Bishop's College, and is the only Hospital of its kind in the Dominion. Opportunity is here afforded to see most of the operations in this important Department of Surgery.

Two GOLD MEDALS ("The Wood" and the "Robert Nelson" Gold Medals) and the "Dr. David" Scholarship are competed for annually.

FEES, about the same as at the other Medical Schools in Canada, but a Student who pays the cost of the entire course on the commencement of his studies is able to effect considerable reduction.
