A BREED OF CATTLE WITH A SINGULAR CHARACTERISTIC ATTRACTIVENESS
Those cattle recognized as the purely dairy breeds,—the Ayrshi res, French Canadians, Guernesy, Jerseys and Hoisteins—will always hold first place in the estimation of dairymen in America. But in addition to these well known breeds there is on this continent a small representation of several other breeds possessing dairy qualities. In this class are the Outon Belted cattle. At the only public test where cows of this breed have competed with other breeds,—the Pan-American Model Dairy test,—the ranked eighth as milk producers, and tenth in butter production. The chief attraction of these cattle is their unusual marking the white blanket around the body always breeding true.
