Resolved, That the Bill do pass; and the title be, "An Act to establish the Conces"sion Line between Ranges four and five of the Township of Buckingham, from Lot One
"to the River Du Lievre."

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their

concurrence.

The Honorable Mr. Rose, from the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce, presented to the House the Fourth Report of the said Committee, which was read, as followeth:—

Your Committee have considered the Bill to incorporate the Simcoe County Bank, and the Bill to amend the Act incorporating the Quebec Marine Insurance Company; also, the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled: "An Act to incorporate certain persons "under the name of the St. Lawrence Navigation Company," to each of which they have agreed to several amendments, which they submit for the consideration of Your Honorable House.

Your Committee have also considered the Bill to amend Chapter 53 of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, respecting Weights and Measures; also, the Bill from the Legislative Council, inituled: "An Act to extend the powers of the Savings Bank known under the name of "La Caisse d'Economie de Notre Dame de Québec," which they beg

leave to report without any amendment.

The Honorable Mr. Attorney General Cartier, from the Standing Committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph Lines, presented to the House the Fourth Report of the said Committee, which was read, as followeth:—

Your Committee have considered the Bill to legalize and confirm an Agreement made between the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada and the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway Company, and have agreed to several amendments thereto, which they submit for the consideration of Your Honorable House.

Thomas Oliver, Esquire, having presented the Indenture of his Election for the North Riding of the County of Oxford, and having previously taken the Oath, according to Law, and subscribed before the Commissioners the Roll containing the same, took his seat in the House.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Attorney General Macdonald, seconded by the

Honorable Mr. Attorney General Cartier,

Resolved, That in admitting Thomas Oliver, Esquire, elected to represent the North Riding of the County of Oxford, to take his seat, on the production of the Duplicate Indenture only, and without the Return of the Indenture of the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, and the Certificate of the latter Officer, this House recommends a strict adherence to the practice of requiring the production of the usual Certificate.

The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into Committee of Ways and Means.
