most enterprising little places in
New Brunswick, and those who have
read the account of Sir Leonard's
visit will have learnt that before
the subjects that occupied the at-
tention of the farmers was first the
Agricultural School and Experi-
ment Farm, which was very modern-
ly and ably discussed. A very good
feeling was expressed that as a class
in relation to their business, farmers
wanted a great deal more informa-
tion. The expense of such an Institu-
tion was conceded, but it was
stated and generally sustained that
