Tomatlan, Mexico.—The wheat acreage in Manitoba is 20
per cent. more than last year.—The re-opening of the Batoche
Convent took place on Monday last.—The fall races on the Kent Driving-
Park will take place on Tuesday, 11th of
September.—Yarmouth was visited with a heavy
thunder-storm last week, lightning striking
in several places.—Four houses were destroyed by fire
on Friday night at the mouth of the Nash-
waik, York County.—Extensive brush fires have been
raging in Annapolis and at one time
threatening severe loss.—A blacksmith, named Lemuel Palmer,
was drowned while bathing on Thursday
last, at Londonderry Mines, N. S.—Mr. James Johnson, Cook-
ville, sells his farm, crop, furniture,
&c., on Thursday next.—Religious.—Rev. E. C. Corey
holds services in Bethel at 11 a.
and at Salem at 7 p. m., next Sab-

auction on 25th inst., by the Sheriff
to S. Clarke, Esq., for \$50.—New Organ.—The Methodist Sab-
bath School have purchased a new
pipe organ, and next month will
give a Sabbath evening concert.—Fined.—D. Wheaton, Esq., Mid-
dixie, was fined \$50 by the
Commissioner Cahill on the com-
plaint of Wm. Finney, for infrac-
tion of the Canada Temperance Act.—MEMORANDUM ITEMS.—The Con-
vent will re-open next Monday.—St.
Joseph's College opens next Tues-
day.—Mr. Jos. Bellevue is seriously
ill, and no hope is expected of his
recovery.—Mr. Allison commenced his new
year on Thursday. The College and
Male Academy have a very good
attendance of students. The Ladies'
Academy commences with some 75
students, 50 being boarders.—The want of house accommoda-
tion in Sackville is quite severely
felt. None are unoccupied and
rents are high. Next season will
be hoped to something to supply
the demand. On Wednesday Street

Ogden and others intend building.—BUILDING OPERATIONS.—Mr. J. L.

addition to the International Hotel,
that will largely increase its accom-
modation.—Mr. H. B. Allison is
finishing three new stores in the
building opposite the new Music
Hall.—The roof is being put on the
new Memorial Hall.—HORSE STOLEN.—Wednesday night

bazaar and fancy sale in Robb's
Hall, on Thursday evening, Sep-
