Dominion Parliament.

(Specials to St. John Sun.)

OTAWA, APRIL 17.

The House met at 3.30. After routine the following bills passed through committee, were read a third time and passed:

To incorporate the International Construction Company.

To amend the charter of the Fellow Medical Manufacturing Company.

The Montreal Telegraph Company Bill.

The House went into committee on the bill to consolidate and amend the Acts relating to the Montreal and Quebec Railway.

(as amended by the standing committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph lines), Mr. Rogers was the chair.

The first twelve clauses were adopted.
