

## The North Star.

CHATHAM, N. B. Nov. 5, '81 OLD LANDMARKS.

Progress is wiping out old landmarks everywhere, just as the rising tide obliterates footprints below high watermark on the sea shore. And, indeed, in England the so-called march of civilization and the ocean billows are alike sweeping away grand monuments of the past. The breakers which are along the Goodwin sands beat over submerged villages of a not far remote time, while the tall cliffs at Flamborough are undermined, and churches, once far inland, now stand tottering on the brink. In busy English centres grand old buildings are yearly demolished to give place to business blocks, and if mayhap the hand of modern im provement should spare a fine church, stowed away in some London trade thoroughfare, it stands in a certain sense apart and alone, like its prototype on the eastern cliffs, awaiting the flood tide of innovation.

The busy current of London

life has for long years surged

past Newgate prison, but its fate

is sealed, and it will shortly disappear. It was finished about

the time Tyburn executions

were abolished, when criminal and clergyman rode to the gallows in a tumbril, the hangman seated in front philosophically smoking his pipe. The boquets which English judges still carry are a survival of the huge bunches of rue and other aromatic herbs which were placed round the courts to check the infection of prison typhus, which a century ago spread from old Newgate to the Sessions house, and killed sixty persons, including two of the judges, the Lord Mayor, and several jurors. The history of Newgate is connected with the age of crime. Dickens sketches some of its features in a Tale of Two Cities. Those were days when a highwayman in the dark was a city tradesman in the light, and being re-cognized and challenged by his tellow-tradesme, gallantly shot him through the head and rode away; when the Lord Mayor of London was made to stand and deliver on Turnham green; when musketeers went into St. Giles' to search for contraband goods, and the mob fired on the musketeers and the musketeers fired on the mob, and nobody thought these occurences out of the common way. Then the office of hangman was no sinecure; one day he hanged an atrocious murderer, and the next a wretched pilferer who had robbed a boy of sixpence. Death was the law's remedy for everything. The forger, the utterer of a bad note, the unlawful opener of a letter, the purloiner of forty shillings and sixpence, the horse stealer, the coiner of a bad shilling, were all hanged for the public weal. But those days are past, and an era of undue severity has been followed by one of undue leniency for the criminal. Along London streets death carts for the public gal-
