7th. The grass of the prairie is very rich in milk, butter, and beef. By the lat of April, before the grass comes up, the ground is all solvent with bundles of white flower which the cattle like; they give the butter the flavour of honey. The cow give richer milk, and as much of it as in any other country. There is more cream and more butter than in Canada. The field is richer and more varied—wild pear, tares, and flowers all summer. Horses from Ontario thrive well, but the owners keep them hoppled or vied up close for fear of losing them in the boundless parture. They have got to est where other horses and cattle lie out at night; flee eat them all day; they pine and ged discovinged. Our horses roam at large ever 90 miles of prairie, and on high spots when flee are bud; they feed moutly along Lake Manifoths winter and sumes, and keep fat. Ossadian horses are housed in winter, and get grain.

8th. The winter is dry, with hard frost all the time, but elear and summy, fine to work in the woods and feed eat-le—all we have got to de. The mow does not fall deep here, from air inshes to one foot; good sleighing overy where—verybody moving—planann't limb—hauling timber and raile—visiting, and breaking colts and steors. We house our milos cows, ealves, weeking heress and oxen; the rest live at the sirn-stack, and are fed hay twice a day. We have few storas, but when they come they are fearful but short; you can't go out in them, but they are seen over and the aky clear again. Not much snow falls, but it is no light the wind blows the most of it into the woods and fences. One warm day in apring leaves our fields bare. We are greparing our ploughs and seed now. Some aweed by the lat April last year; I think it will be as early this year. I understand there will be a large emigration from the States this summer.
