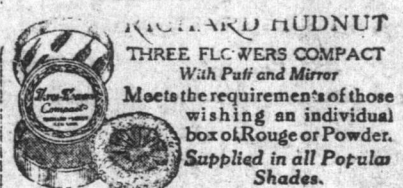

Work at New Hotel Progressing

STONE AND BRICK WORK WELL IN HAND.

The new hotel being built for the Nfld. Facilities, Ltd., has been raised to its full height and the work of laying the concrete roof is now nearing completion. The work of brick laying and setting the Benedict stone, which is being used as trim is well in hand. The texture of the base course of stone work is granite and that of the upper portions will be Indiana limestone. This stone is being used in most of the new hotels, office buildings, etc., throughout America. Its cool grey in contrast with the yellow of the Scotch brick makes a very pleasing effect. After the brick and stone work is completed the whole face will be washed and cleaned with special liquids which bring out the real tone of the materials. As the brick and stone work is being laid the hollow tiles used as backing are placed and the whole banded together. The hollow tile is conducive to dryness and free ventilation. Unlike buildings of solid masonry, those in which they are used do not sweat when mild days follow a frosty spell. A feature in building construction not seen here before is the use of patent scaffolding machines. They are suspended from above by steel cables and afford absolute safety to the workmen. These scaffolds are of a type that can be covered in so that when the weather is cold or stormy the bricklayers can continue working without inconvenience. In a very short while the brickwork will be finished to the second floor and it is the intention of the general contractors to close in the windows and floor openings and by means of temporary radiators heat the flat so that simultaneous with the brickwork the interior trim and plastering can be carried on throughout the winter. The heating of the building will be extended upwards as the brickwork progresses. The head of

the firm of Farquhar & Sons, the plumbing and heating contractors, will arrive here by S. S. Rosalind to superintend the work of installation. At the present rate of progress it is anticipated that the hotel will be completed well within the specified time.

CATHEDRAL WOMEN'S ASSN.

The tea tables were largely patronized, and the ladies in charge were kept busy attending to the wants of their guests.

Highroads Commission Case

In the matter of the Highways Commission vs. W. J. Snow and Thomas J. Griffin, who are charged with obtaining money under false pretences, the hearing was resumed yesterday evening before Judge Morris. Mr. W. R. Warren was heard on behalf of Snow after which Mr. Barron opened his case in defence of Griffin and called John Murphy. The witness gave his age as sixteen, and said he had worked one day on the road and that when he went to get paid, at the same time as the other men, his name was not on the pay sheet and he could not get his money, but a couple of days afterwards Mr. Griffin paid him the amount due in cash. The evidence of John Murphy (Sr.) was then recalled, which stated that he had returned a portion of the cheque that had been given him and which was for a larger amount than he had worked for, because at the time Mr. Griffin told him there was another John Murphy to be paid out of it. Mr. Jas. Griffin, one of the defendants, was then put in the witness box, and his examination by Mr. Barron continued until six o'clock, when adjournment was taken until 4.30 this afternoon.
