

Serious Difficulty Over a Clause of the Bill.

Return of the Civic Deputation From the Capital.

The City's Side of the Case-The Sydicate Refuse to Withdraw the Clause
—Will the Lease be Knocked Out? -Special Meeting of the Council Called - Electric Matters Looked Into.

Mayor Essery, Ald. Parnell, Ald. F. J. Fitzgerald and Ald. Coo, members of the civic railway deputation, returned from Ottawa and Montreal to-day. They looked tired and worried with the vast amount of information they brought back and the troublesome developments at the capital, The city solicitor and engineer are still in Montreal.

Montreal.

Events at Ottawa were very serious indeed. Judging by the tone of their remarks, it has come to a straight pull between the city and the syndicate. The latter want a certain clause put through, and the deputation absolutely declined to assent to it. For that reason a special meeting of the council will be held Saturday night, at which everything will be elucidated. A member of the deputation explained the trouble thus:

Members of the railway committee suggested that we should try and arrange it between us. We did so, after considerable trouble and humbug. We asked Mr. Ivey to put his case in writing. He then conceded everything we wanted except clause 12. There's the rub. 'We cannot concede clause 12,' said Mr. Ivey,' because we will not be in a rosition to carry on the railway without the privileges that it gives us.'
