Owing to the Fact That Infection Has Been Discovered There By the Physicians.

Owing to infection having been discovered in the maternity ward at Victoria Hospital, the ward has been closed indefinitely, and will not be opened again until it has been thoroughly disinfected.

Miss Stanley, lady superintendent of Victoria, stated to The Advertiser today that the infection had appeared at a most important time, as the hospital is full to the doors, and many doctors have requests in for rooms.

"There seems to be a very great deal of sickness of all kinds in the city at the present time," she said, "and the hospital accommodation is taxed to its utmost."

CONSUMPTIVE WAS REFUSED ADMISSION

Pitiable Case of Old Man Turned Away From Victoria Hospital.

Another case which shows the urgent necessity of a hospital for the care of tubercular patients came to public notice yesterday, when Thomas McCaveny, or Crumlin, a man in the last stages of consumption, who has been living alone in a little house and caring for himself, was refused admission to Victoria Hospital.

Under the existing bylaws there was nothing else for the authorities at the hospital to do, as the case was one that excited the utmost pity, even among nurses and physicians accustomed to sad sights.

McCaveny is a man about 55 years of age and is a patient of Dr. McWilliams. He went to the hospital yesterday, as he is in a terribly weakened condition. As soon as it was learned that he was a tubercular patient he was refused admission, and had to make his way back to the little house in Crumlin where he could.

Dr. McWilliams stated to The Advertiser today that he does not know what will become of the man, as he has no money, and no one will stay with him in the house to care for him. In the last stages of tuberculosis the patient's strength leaves rapidly, and unless something is done McCaveny will be left to die alone.

LORD STRATHCONA'S PATRIOTIC PROPOSAL

Will Give \$10,000 Yearly for Physical and Military Training of Youth.

Ottawa, March 24. — The patriotic spirit of the House of Commons was profoundly touched this afternoon by the announcement made by the Minister of Militia of an offer by Lord Strathcona to contribute to a fund, to be administered by trustees, of \$10,000 per annum for the purpose of encouraging physical and military training of the public schools of the Dominion.

The announcement came to the members as a complete surprise and was greeted with enthusiastic cheers from both sides of the House. Lord Strathcona's letter was dated March 13, and stated that he was anxious to take part in the good work of training the youth of our Canada.

He recommended that the following compose the board, which shall administer the fund: President, the Minister of Militia; vice-president, the Minister of Education; and the Ministers of Education in the various provinces, which will adhere to the principles agreed upon between the department of militia and the Province of Nova Scotia, and made applicable to the other provinces by an order-in-council of Aug. 30, 1908.

The Council.

The executive council shall be: (a) The members of the militia council; (b) representatives to be named by the ministers of education in Ontario and Quebec, and by the other provinces; (c) military officers commanding commands and independent districts of the Dominion.

In a private letter to the Minister of Militia in connection with the matter Lord Strathcona stated that as soon as he was notified of the acceptance of the offer he would forward a check for \$250,000.

Sir Frederick Borden announced that he had cabled to Lord Strathcona a grateful acceptance of the generous offer and asked his permission to name the fund "The Strathcona Trust."

Sir Frederick also stated that Earl Grey had agreed to become patron of the trust and Sir Wilfrid Laurier vice-patron.

Lord Strathcona Thanked.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier moved that the thanks of Parliament and of the people of Canada be tendered to Lord Strathcona for his offer. Physically, he said, but he believed none was of greater importance than that of physical education as so necessary as now. He believed the organization proposed would be of great benefit to the youth of Canada.

The motion was carried. The Minister of Militia, in accepting the offer, said that Lord Strathcona's act was entirely in accordance with the patriotic action which had distinguished his wonderful career. The encouragement of physical training and elementary drill among the children of the country was a most important matter, and he had no doubt that the movement would be stimulated in the future.
