COLIMA IN ERUPTION THOUSANDS IN PERIL

Gale by Blowing Away Poisonous Gases Saves Lives of Villagers.

[Canadian Press.] Guadalajara, Mexico, Jan. 21.—The volcano of Colima broke into violent eruption yesterday afternoon. Thousands of people fled from the villages and ranches in the vicinity. It is not improbable that there has been some loss of life at a distance from the volcano. A gale of refugees arrived in this city this morning on a train composed of box cars, which had been picked up on a siding at a nearby village. The fleeing people had found it necessary to shovel away a quantity of volcanic sand before they were able to move the cars, and for many miles along the way where the train had to be stopped frequently in order that the sand which prevented its progress might be moved from the tracks. Little lava was ejected from the crater, which, however, emitted vast quantities of smoke and sand, while suffocating gases formed an unusual feature of the eruption. A gale was blowing from the northwest and this probably saved many of the inhabitants of the surrounding districts, as it caused the flying sand and deadly gases to pass over their heads. The last violent eruption of Colima occurred in 1903.

CANADIAN SHIPBUILDERS ASK FOR PROTECTION

Subsidy or Bonus Is Needed If Industry Is Not To Be Wiped Out by Competition With Great Britain and the United States.

Ottawa, Jan. 21.—Unless the Dominion Government takes immediate and effective measures for the protection and encouragement of the shipbuilding industry of the Dominion, by according it greater protection from British, United States and foreign competition, it will quickly go out of existence.

This in brief was the substance of a somewhat lengthy and comprehensive memorial placed before Premier Borden this afternoon by a big deputation representing shipbuilding firms from the Atlantic to the Pacific.

Ask Protection. The protection and preserving of the industry by granting a protection of 20 per cent. in the way of tariff legislation, or by subsidy, was strongly urged by the deputation. Under existing conditions of competition with

Great Britain this step they considered as absolutely necessary to prevent the quick disappearance of Canadian shipbuilding.

Canada's Handicap. It was pointed out that Canadian firms are compelled to pay duty on much of the material for building purposes, as well as upon a great deal of equipment, and with this handicap had to compete with the great shipbuilding organizations of Britain, where wages and the cost of every kind of material were more than 20 per cent. cheaper.

Premier Borden listened to the points made by the various spokesmen of the deputation, and in his reply he promised to give the most earnest consideration to their request. He suggested that the Government might well adopt a policy of having all Government vessels built in Canada, even should the cost be greater than it would be if the orders were placed in Britain.

NO DUTY ON MEATS DEMOCRATS' PLAN

Also They Put Free Cattle on List and Other Necessaries of Life.

Washington, Jan. 22.—"Free meat," proposed by the House Democrats at the last session of Congress, but blocked by a Presidential veto, was indicated as part of the extra session of the Congress tariff revision program at the hearing before the House committee on ways and means today.

Members of the committee emphasized the majority sentiment in favor of free meats and a strong trend toward free cattle, in accord with the general policy of the Democrats last year to transfer the necessities of life to the free list, including free sugar and free lumber.

RECOUNT ASKED IN LOCAL OPTION VOTE

Temperance People at Forest Are Confident of Result.

FREE TRADE MAN SUCCEEDS DEAKIN

Elected Leader of Liberal Opposition in Australian Parliament.

Melbourne, Jan. 22.—Joseph Cook, a pronounced free trader, has been elected leader of the Liberal party to succeed Alfred Deakin, resigned. The appointment was made at a special conference of the Opposition, when it was stipulated that the present Commonwealth tariff should be maintained.

It was further urged that a non-political commission be appointed to supervise industrial production and consider a commercial exchange tariff.
