WILL ENFORCE DAIRY MEASURE

Resolution To Leave Standards Act Optional Meets With Defeat.

IS BEATEN 60 TO 14

W. H. Casselman, U. F. O. Member For Dundas, Tests Opinion of Legislature.

Toronto, March 31.—The resolution of W. H. Casselman, to postpone enforcement of the Dairy Standards Act was defeated yesterday afternoon in the Ontario Legislature, after a lengthy debate, by a vote of 60 to 14.

The opposition against the enforcement of the Dairy Standards Act broke forth when W. H. Casselman (U. F. O., Dundas), after explaining that he had used his best endeavors to have Minister of Agriculture Doherty change his course and allow the act to remain optional, but to no avail, moved a resolution to test the house on the question.

The dairy standards act as amended last year will force all cheese and butter factories to pay for the milk they receive on the basis of its butter fat content instead of simply by weight. Up to this year it has been optional which basis would be used. The test system has vigorous supporters and likewise vigorous opponents. The act also provides that the whey—the byproduct of this is to prevent disease germs reaching the swine fed with the whey.

The discussion on this question occupied the whole afternoon with the exception of a few minutes taken to pass the act to validate the Shevlin-Clark agreement through the house committee. The galleries were well filled, many of the huge delegation here to discuss the act remaining to hear the argument on this question.

Casselman Outlines Act. Mr. Casselman outlined the life of the

dairy standards act in Ontario since it was passed in 1916. In view of strenuous protests, its enforcement was postponed in 1917 and remained so until last year, when it was again made obligatory. He pointed out his long experience in the dairy business both as a farmer, salesman and buyer of cheese in a big way, and took the position that this was a very opportune time to insist that all milk to factories be paid for on its butter fat content and on the pasteurization of whey. He maintained that while there might have been some demand for his legislation from certain cattle breeders, there was no demand from the rank and file of the dairy farmers.

He argued that records showed that Ontario produced the best cheese of its kind in the world last year, and it obtained a higher average price for it than any other part of the world. This was done with the dairy standards act optional, and he thought it should be left that way. The argument for pasteurizing whey was far-fetched, he said.

D. K. Denyes (Hastings East) supported the resolution, claiming that the farmers in his district were strongly opposed to the test system. The pasteurizing of whey would mean larger boilers in many factories, while testing the milk would mean additional expense, while at the same time the farmers would not be so well satisfied as they are under the present system.

R. M. Warren (Renfrew) took the opposite view, maintaining that once farmers adopted the Babcock test they would not go back to the old system, and that it made for better herds when the farmers were paid for quality in milk.

Doherty Defends Measure. Minister of Agriculture Hon. Manning Doherty, in defending the act, said that additional cost of operating under the act would be inconsiderable. The money lost in bitter cheese last year reached thousands of dollars. It would have been largely eliminated if the act had been in force. This year would not only have offset any expense in equipping the factories for the provisions of the act, but built many of them.

If there are tubercular cows in the district the germs are apt, through the whey, to be transferred to the swine. He was not prepared to support an act that would cause the slaughter of all cattle which react to a tubercular test. The spread of disease among herds was being looked after by the health of animals branch at Ottawa, which was second to none in the world.

He urged that it was only by paying for quality in milk that this province could retain its lead in the cheese markets of the world.

Hon. G. Howard Ferguson, while supporting the principle of the dairy standards act, objected to its being put into force this season when the farmers were carrying on under such difficulties. In Eastern Ontario there were many small factories where even a small additional expense was a burden.

"This will mean at most \$3 expense for each patron, and I guarantee it will bring back three times that amount this very year," Doherty replied.

He said the time to introduce this change was when prices are low.

REICHSTAG VOTES DEMANDS UNJUST

Berlin, March 20.—A resolution declaring the demands of the reparations commission are intolerable and expressing approval of Chancellor Wirth's statements with regard to the commission's demands, was passed by the Reichstag today. The vote was 248 to 81. Socialists and Communists abstained from voting.

ATTACKS DRURY'S ACTION ON TAXES

Brockville, March 31.—Speaking here last night, in opposition to the separate school taxation proposals of Bishop Fallon, Dr. J. W. Edwards of Kingston criticized Premier Drury for offering and agreeing, on behalf of the Ontario Government, to bear the expenses of taking the matter to the courts. He argued that the Orange Order had expended a large sum of money in connection with the Tremblay Quebec marriage case and that in this instance those seeking to test the law should also "dig down" and bear the expenses.

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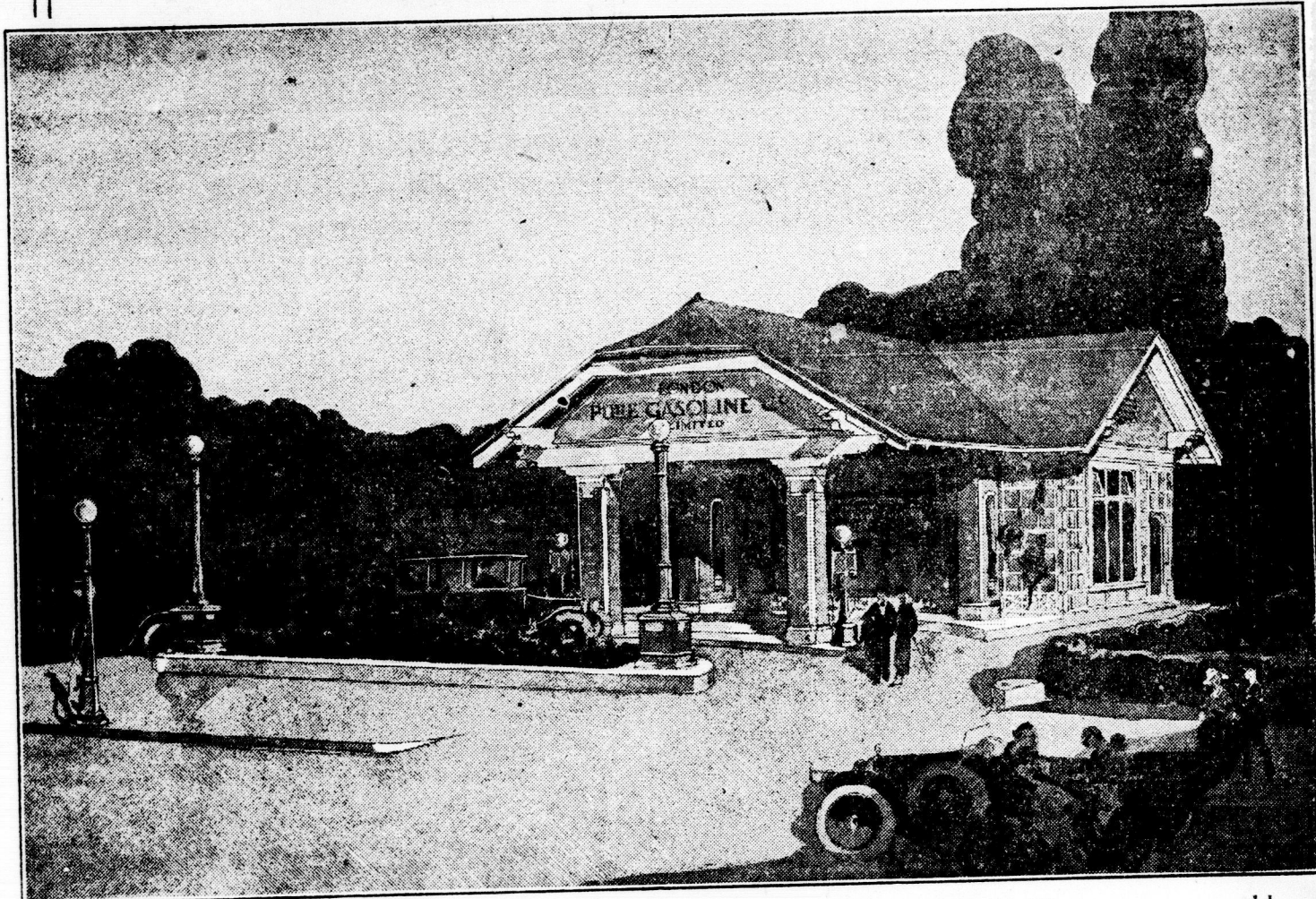
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
