Golden Grain. The Ontario crop bulletin just issued justi-fies the bright hopes with which people look forward to the coming winter. Fall wheat, spring wheat, barley, oats and peas show an estimated yield per acre away above that of last year or of the average for the previous

Then when our farmers come to sweep out their granaries it will be found that On-tario's wheat crop has a value. The superior quality of the new crop of fall wheat is evi-denced by what is being offered on the Local Grain Exchange. In the past very little of the wheat offered graded more than 60 lbs. to the bushel. Now that placed upon the market as a rule averages 2 to 4 lbs. per bushel more, while 60-lb, or standard grade is rarely heard. Then, too, the great crop in the Northwest sold at the ex-pected prices would distribute millions of dollars over a region with which all Canada is commercially linked. Usually the greater the yield the lower prices are, but when the increased yield is local, and the world's crop as a whole is a failure, prices must be high. This is said to be the condition now.


