These figures show an increase of six in the total number of interments compared with the corresponding month of last year, and a decrease of two compared with April, 1893. Compared with March of the present year there is a decrease of 35.

Analysis of the Returns.

At Mount Pleasant Cemetery out of the pointerments 22 were those of children; there were only 8 persons buried above 70 years of age. Pneumonia was credited with 6 deaths, phthisis 4 and diphtheria, bronchitis, scarlet fever and typhoid fever leach.

At the Necropolis the interments were 14 less than in the corresponding month last year. Seven were children and there was only one septuagenarian. Among the certified causes of death were: Diphtheria 2, phthisis 2, pneumonia, bronchitis and typhoid fever leach.

At St. James' Cemetery the interments were 114, as against precisely the same number last year. This is a notable coincidence. eventy-one were children, only 10 were bove 70 years of age. There were 8 deaths om pneumonia, 8 from bronchitis, 7 from phtheria, 2 from scarlet fever and 1 from phoid fever.

At St. Michael's there were 55 interments, an increase of 14 compared with May last year. Twenty caildren were interred and only 11 old people. The following were among the causes of death: Phthisis 5, bronchitis 3, pneumonia 2, typhoid fever 1.

Of the 9 interments in Prospect Cemetery 6 were children. The ages of the others were 26, 45, 70. One death was ascribed to diphtheria and 1 to scarlet fever.

On the whole last month's returns were more satisfactory than any recorded this year.


