In fact, gentlemen, when I look about me, and see the course of those who attended lectures with me, I am struck with the fact, that those who have been most successful are those who upon every possible opportunity were at the bedside, examining, watching and recording cases. If I could urge no higher motive than that pecuniary and professional success was the sure reward of the close hospital student, I would still press you to it. But there is a nobler motive still, and when I mention it I am sure it will find a response in every breast. You accept a high and noly trust, when the parchment, which certifies your qualification to practice the healing art, is placed in your possession. For the proper fulfilment of that trust you will one day have to give an account. It is therefore your duty to your fellow men to prepare in every possible way, so that when called to practice your profession, you may be able to bring to your aid every possible element of success. I know of none more likely to come to your assistance, when you first commence practice, and lack that which will alone give you confidence-experience—than the hours and days you have passed in Hospital attendance. At the very commencement then of your student's career I would advise your commencing "to walk" the Hospital. Not in the too literal application of some students, who walk the wards without ever making an attempt to listen to the clinical remarks, passing their time in frivolous amusement, but with an honest determination to avail yourself of every opportunity to increase your store of practical knowledge.
