to give it up for the present, and concentrate all your energies on the work which now lies befere you. For, as Milton expresses it :--

"Not to know at large of things remote From use, obscure and subtle, but to know That which before us lies in daily life, Is the prime wisdom ; what is more, is fume Or emptiness, cr fond impertinence, And renders us in things that most concern,  $U \perp_P$  ractised, unprepared, and still to learn."

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
