the Department they vere not granted diplomatic status and were not, in Eencral, eligible for service abroad. sxceptions were the appointment of two women to posts abrosa, one with consulaz and one vith local diplomatic rank. The fipst open conpetition in which vomen vere pernitted to compete was hela in July, 1947, and appointments of women with full diplonatic'status have since been made.

As Canada's interestis multiply in the international field, the work of the Department continues to grov. To meet these increased responsibilities, the Department now has in Ottawa and abroad a total of more than 170 officers and 800 clerical personnel.
