## Introduction

This report is an overview of the discussions at the Roundtable on Reporting by States Parties to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT) hosted by the Canadian Network to Abolish Nuclear Weapons, the Canadian Centre for Foreign Policy Development, and the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade (DFAIT) in Ottawa on 19-20 June 2003.

The purpose of the Roundtable was to examine how States parties to the NPT have responded to the reporting requirements agreed at the 2002 NPT Review Conference and to consider how such reporting might be improved in the future. The Roundtable examined the reporting experiences at the 2002 and 2003 NPT Preparatory Committee (PrepCom) meetings, considered the content of reporting by both nuclear-weapon States (NWS) and non-nuclear-weapon States (NNWS), and discussed the use of the report by states and groups of states. The Roundtable also considered the reporting requirements for the 2005 NPT Review Conference.
