## PRAYERS:

Mr. Steele, from the Select Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, presented the Tenth Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:—

Your Committee have considered the Bill No. 179 (Letter A4 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Margery Berridge Grey," and have agreed to report the same without any amendment.

Owing to the advanced stage of the session Your Committee recommend that the said Bill be placed on the Order Paper this day immediately after Routine Proceedings for consideration in Committee of the Whole, and further that all additional charges paid on the Bill be refunded.

On motion of Mr. Richardson, it was ordered, That in accordance with the recommendation contained in the Tenth Report of the Select Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, Bill No. 179 (Letter A4 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Margery Berridge Grey," be placed on the Order Paper this day immediately after Routine Proceedings for consideration in Committee of the Whole.

On motion of Mr. Richardson, it was ordered, That in accordance with the recommendation contained in the Tenth Report of the Select Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills all additional charges paid on Bill No. 179 (Letter A4 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Margery Berridge Grey," be refunded.

Mr. Maclean (Halifax), a Member of the King's Privy Council, for Sir Thomas White, delivered a Message from His Excellency the Governor General, which was read by the Speaker, as follows:—
