If that entails legislation the government would consider it, and hopefully, this year.

Mr. Lewis: Mr. Speaker, I wish to direct a supplementary on the same subject to the Prime Minister. Can the right hon. gentleman inform the house whether it is the intention of the government to implement a recommendation by a member of the Fisheries Research Board that the government ought to establish a single federal agency to deal with the problems of pollution across the country, or is that agency now in the Department of National Health and Welfare?

Mr. Munro: Mr. Speaker, so far as one over-all agency to deal with this question is concerned, that would be a decision for the government to make. As the situation now stands the studies on air pollution are being conducted in the Department of National Health and Welfare. We have been doing quite a bit of work in this field up to the present time. We have been discussing the matter with the provinces and, as I say, subject to getting agreement on certain standards in our consultation with the provinces, perhaps we might be able to bring in legislation this year.

Mr. Lewis: Mr. Speaker, I wish to direct another supplementary question, this time if I may to the Minister of Justice. Will his department look into the allegations contained in the report of the International Joint Commission and consider laying charges against the two corporations for polluting the St. Marys' River, if they are doing so as alleged by the commission, and will any other steps be taken to follow up that disclosure by this important international body?

Hon. John N. Turner (Minister of Justice): Yes, sir, we will certainly look into it. If charges are to be laid the matter might well fall within the purview of the provincial attorney general.
