over 30 years the small business sector would have created more jobs than that.

Here is my question, and I would like to know if the Minister can give a yes or no answer. Is the shutdown of that truck centre caused by the opening of a Volvo-GM Heavy Truck Company plant in the United States? Are our Canadian jobs going down to the United States? Is that this Government's free trade policy?

Hon. Michel Côté (Minister of Regional Industrial Expansion): Absolutely not, Mr. Speaker. I think indeed that our effort in the case of GM's Sainte-Thérèse plant, a \$110 million assistance, not only as I said maintained existing jobs but also helped increase certain jobs in Quebec, in Ontario and in each of the regions especially in the regions involved, at GM in Sainte-Thérèse. There again one of the regions where Government help was needed to build the industrial base that is essential to their economic welfare.

EL SALVADOR—UNION WORKERS FIRED UPON BY MILITARY

Mr. Dan Heap (Spadina): Mr. Speaker, my question is for the Secretary of State for External Affairs. Last Thursday, according to telephone reports, in El Salvador the United Workers of El Salvador were demonstrating peacefully for the release of hundreds of political prisoners illegally held in Mariona Prison, when the military opened fire on them, seriously wounding Julio Portillo, the Secretary-General of the union, in the back.

I would ask the Minister whether he will request the Duarte Government to account for this violence and for the growing attacks during the last few months by the Duarte Government against trade unionists.

Right Hon. Joe Clark (Secretary of State for External Affairs): Mr. Speaker, once again the Hon. Member has brought to my attention on the floor of the House information I did not previously have. I will look into the matter and will report back to him.

I can report to him, with regard to the question he raised the other day, that my officials here had no information in Ottawa in respect of Antonio Hernandez. We have requested our Embassy in San José to make inquiries. I will advise the Hon. Member of the results of those inquiries as soon as I receive them.

Mr. Heap: I thank the Minister for the information on the previous request. The request I have just given was sent

yesterday to the Minister's office, but perhaps it has not arrived yet.

An Hon. Member: Did you send it through the Post Office?

Mr. Heap: No, it was sent from my office to the Minister's office, not by way of Alberta or any of the loons out there.

Some Hon. Members: Oh, oh!

Mr. Heap: Mr. Speaker-
