

PRAYERS.

The Honourable Senator Cameron moved, seconded by the Honourable Senator Stambaugh—

Resolved,—That it is expedient that the Houses of Parliament approve the Statute of the International Atomic Energy Agency signed by Canada at New York on October 26, 1956, and that this House do approve the same.

After debate, and—

The question being put on the motion, it was—

Resolved in the affirmative.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Senate resumed the adjourned debate on the motion of the Honourable Senator Croll, seconded by the Honourable Senator Farquhar—

That this House approve Canada's foreign policy, with particular reference to its policies with respect to the Middle East, Hungary and aid to under-developed countries.

After further debate, and—

The question being put on the motion, it was—

Resolved in the affirmative.

The Order of the Day being called for the second reading of the Bill (B), intituled: "An Act to confirm an Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Province of New Brunswick respecting Indian Reserves", it was—

Ordered, That it be postponed until the next sitting of the Senate.

The Order of the Day being called to resume the adjourned debate on the motion of the Honourable Senator Connolly (*Ottawa West*), seconded by the Honourable Senator Connolly (*Halifax North*), for the third reading of Bill (Y-7), intituled: "An Act to amend the Government Property Traffic Act", and the proposed amendment by the Honourable Senator Pouliot, seconded by the Honourable Senator Croll, that the Bill be not now read a third time but that it be referred back to the Standing Committee on Transport and Communications to complete the evidence relating to the Senate property outside the Parliament Building (Central Block), it was—

Ordered, That it be postponed until the next sitting of the Senate.

The Honourable Senator Macdonald, P.C., moved, seconded by the Honourable Senator Vaillancourt, that when the Senate adjourns to-day it do stand adjourned until Monday next, at eight o'clock in the evening.
