Dear Mr. Harlow :-

Let me acknowledge receipt of your letter of yesterday.

I am very sorry but it is impossible for me to call a meeting of the Athletic Board of McGill in the near future for the special purpose of having that body listen to any misunderstandings which occurred between you, as representing the Montreal Ski Club, and Major Forbes and Dr. Lamb of McGill University. As a matter of fact the Athletic Board know nothing of what has transpired and your good name has been in no way prejudiced. It so happens that next week I must spend three days out of Montreal, while another afternoon is taken up with the meeting of the Montreal Anti-Tuberculosis and General Health League, of which I am Chairman. I meally cannot afford another couple of hours in the afternoon to such a meeting as you desire.

Please do not misunderstand my attitude. I fully appreciate your desire to give your side of the story, and believe me when I say that because you are asked to wait for a little while your case will not be prejudiced. I am asking
