## BILL SD-12.

## An Act for the relief of Alethea Sarah Ivy Fowler.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Alethea Sarah Ivy Fowler, residing at Beebe, in the province of Quebec, wife of Irwin Fowler, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Coaticook, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the third day of October, A.D. 5 1934, at the city of Sherbrooke, in the said province, she then being Alethea Sarah Ivy Arnold; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved 10 by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved. **1.** The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and 15 shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
