2. ORGANIZATION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, ONTARIO.

REGULATIONS, SANCTIONED BY THE HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION.

(To be observed by the Officers, Clerks, and all others concerned.)

The following shall be the Divisions or Branches of the Education Office :-

I. THE DEPARTMENTAL.

Comprising :-

- All matters coming directly under control of the MINISTER, or EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.
- All matters involving the policy of the Government on Educational subjects.
- 3. Official decisions and other special acts of the MINISTER OF EDUCATION.

Note. - All correspondence arising in this Branch shall pass through the Secretary of the Department, as may be directed by the MINISTER, or, in his absence, by the Deputy Minister.

II. THE ADMINISTRATIVE BRANCH,

Having to do with the administration of existing High and Public School Laws and Regulations and various routine matters of the office shall be under the personal supervision of the Deputy Minister, subject to such directions as the MINISTER or Education may from time to time give.

III. THE FINANCIAL BRANCH.

The details of this Branch shall remain in the hands of the Accountant, under the Supervision of the Deputy Minister.
All financial matters shall be submitted to the MINISTER, except where specially provided for by law, or already prescribed. The expenditure shall be supervised by the Deputy, and the accounts, when approved by the MINISTER or Deputy, shall be sent for payment to the Treasury Department by the Accoun-
