the organs of public reafon, laws the refult of the most equitable compofition between men, and the adminiftration could not do any thing difpleasing to the people. Here it may be asked, how comes it, that all governments, even those accounted the most free, have hitherto fallen so much short of this perfection? The answer may be given in one word. The difficulty, if not the impossibility of making and supporting the regulations I have hinted.

Whoever confiders the inequalities of property among us, their caufes, and the diverfity of fentiments, thence arifing, will foon be convinced, that we have little ground to expect either fuch laws or fuch government. What are we to think then of the fpeculations of thofe, who argue and affert, that every article
