MAKING ARTIFICIAL SNAILS.

But it is to be presumed that they do not know that the snails are artificial and they are certainly ignorant of the method by which the snails are manufactured. Snail shells, it seems, explains The Scientific American, are bought from the dustmen and ragpickers and after being cleaned are filled with "lights" or cats' meat, the soft fiesh bing cut into corkscrew form, so as to fit the shell, by a skilffully designed machine. The receptacle is then scaled by means of liquid fat and the escargot is ready for the customer. The secret came out in consequence of an action brought by a man employed at the snail factory to recover damages for a finger mutitated by one of the machines. WORLD'S LARGEST LOOM.

At Rodewich, in Saxony, the centre of the German textile industry, there has been set up what is thought to be the largest weaving loom in the world. This huge crank loom is '77 feet long and 60 feet wide. It stands 10 feet high and weighs 35 tons. The shuttle is of corresponding proportions, and travels to and fro at the rate of 15 times a minute. The machine is capable of turning out seamliess disks of felt, such as are used in paper mills, up to 235 feet in circumference.
