

LABOR PARTY NOT FAVORED

Gompers and Conservative Element in A. F. of L. Oppose Radical Move Proposed.

ROCHESTER, N.Y., Nov. 19.—(Can. Press.)—An all-day discussion of the Sherman anti-trust law, as interpreted in the Debury Hatters case today, prevented consideration by the American Federation of Labor convention of the minority report by the committee on education, favoring the adoption of industrial unionism. Discussion on the Sherman law was ended at 5 o'clock, and the question of taking steps to encourage its amendment was referred back to the committee on the president's report, which will make a recommendation later in the week. By a special order of business, discussion of industrial unionism was set to follow the Sherman law discussion and will be taken up tomorrow morning. All-day speakers arraigned the Sherman law as a menace to the rights of workers to associate for purposes of common interest. On this point there was agreement, but difference of opinion arose as to the best means to combat the law. Members of the radical wing of the convention argued for political action thru a party organized in the workers' interests as the only means. President Gompers and other members of the conservative wing held that the remedy lay in the election of labor men of whatever political affiliation to congress and agitation against the law by time-worn union methods. Whatever means is employed, it was the convention's sentiment that the law must, the words of President Gompers, be amended or ended.

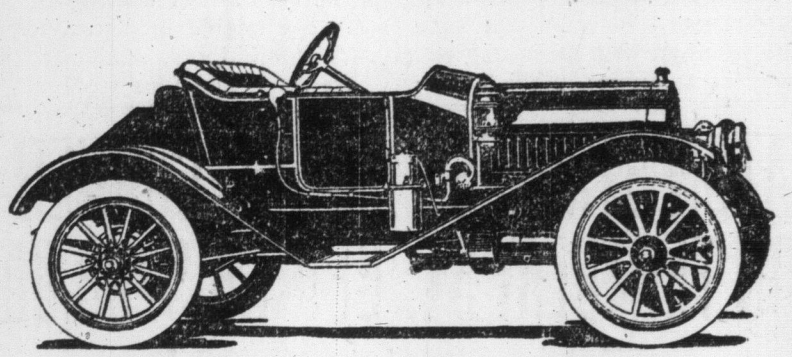

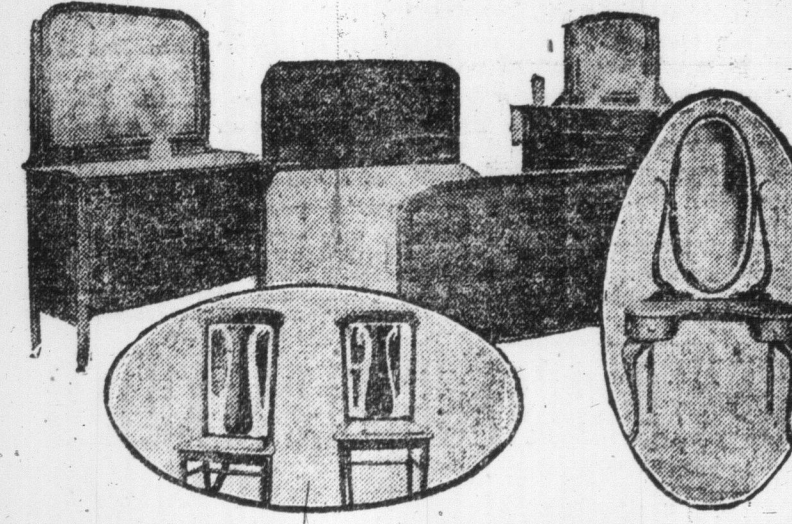

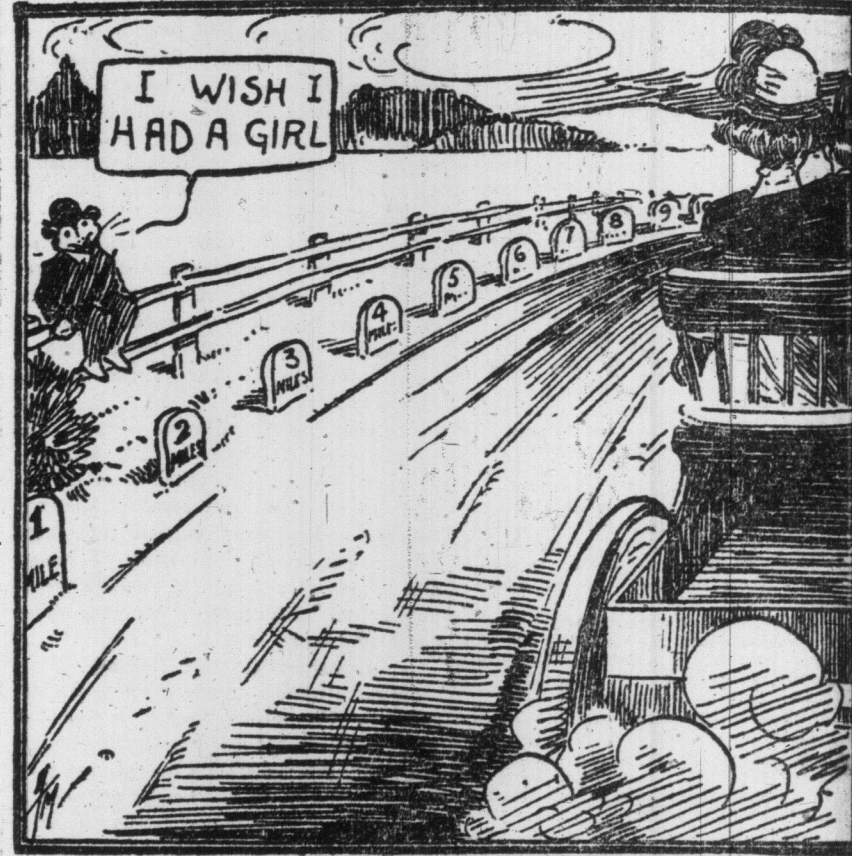
