

FORTY-FIVE IN THE FIELD

Names of Civic Candidates in Toronto Sent By the City Clerk to the Printer.

FORTY-NINE ARE TO BE SELECTED.

Government Will Authorize a Chain Ferry at the Queen's Wharf—A Scandal Mooted.

Eighty-five citizens are in the field in Toronto for municipal honors. Three are out for Mayor, 61 for alderman and 21 for school trustees. Of these 33 must be rejected and the other 49 selected.

Nominations had until noon yesterday to retire. After that the names were submitted by the City Clerk to the printer. As a result the names of the following candidates will appear on the ballot papers:
