Besides this, Austria being in an inferior condition to France, because of her lack of colonles and territorial possessions, merely wishes to maintain what she already has—supremacy, more than protection over the Catholic clergy in certain parts of the Balkans, especially in Albania, where subventions are made to the Catholics, Austria needing their influence for political and commercial purposes.

Outside of Austria, no Catholic country, it is believed, can take over the protection of the Catholics in the far east, Spain being too weak and Italy being in conflict with the holy see. The possibility of entrusting the task to a non-Catholic country was never contemplated.

France herself was never really entrusted with the protection of the Catholics by official documents from the Vatican, but undertook it spontaneously. The protection of the faithful in the states of the different oriental potentates offered her an opportunity to extend her influence.

It was only in 1884 that the Vatican sent explicit instructions to all Catholic missionaries to apply always and only to France. This step is said to have been taken in accordance with a plan conceived by Pope Leo to form a compact between France and the Vatican, so that when, at an earlier or lateriday, the republic's revenge against Germany came, it would also mean a reconquest of temporal power for the papacy.
