PARENTS REFUSED TO WORK. Five Families at Chatham Will Be Deported.

CHATHAM, March 17.—Government Inspector Boston of the department of immigration arrived in the city this morning and secured the services of the police in rounding up five immigrant families, 29 in all, mostly small children, who were deported.

The charge was that the heads of the families refused to accept work when offered them. They were summarily taken from their homes and hustled to the C.P.R. station, then off to East London.

A PRINCE DEGRADED. BERLIN, March 17.—Prince Joachim Albrecht of Prussia, son of the late regent of Brunswick, and a second cousin of Emperor William, has resigned from the army, where he had the rank of major, and will not again be permitted to wear the German uniform.

The resignation of the prince, it is declared, was requested by Emperor William. According to The Mittell Zeitung, Emperor William has been extremely dissatisfied with the prince because of his continued relations with the Baroness Liebenberg, formerly an actress.
