## YESTERDAY AT BEAULAH CAMP

### Committees Appointed at Meeting of Baptist Alliance.

Beulah Camp Ground, July 4 (Special) - Much important business was transacted at the meetings of the alliance today. Among other matters it was announced that they had secured control of the telephone line from Rockville. Host to Brown's Flats, which passes through the camp grounds, thus giving better communication with the city. Rev. D. J. Trafton presented the report of the committee on temperance in which he urged ministers and people to try to secure provincial prohibition. Alliance committees were also named to have charge of the camp at Riverview (Me.).

In the morning Rev. Mr. Trafton presented the report of the committee on temperance as follows: "Your committee on temperance has left to report their regret that more progress has not been made in the direction of securing national prohibition. We would urge upon our ministers and people the necessity of moving to secure provincial prohibition instead."

Let us vote for good and honest men who stand pledged to support such a measure in the legislature irrespective of party. We believe that the training out of this evil will help to answer the prayers of all true Christians.

We praise God for the influence that the teaching of holiness has had on the church against the use of tobacco, opium, morphine, etc., and we urge upon our ministers and people the necessity of keeping the standard high."

Grass, to have charge of the grounds; Rev. F. A. Baker, H. D. Archer and T. D. Wiggins, hotel; The alliance decided after much prayer to give Rev. M. S. Trafton, St. John; Rev. F. A. Baker, Woodstock, and Rev. W. B. Wiggins, B. H. Comman, charge of the camp meetings there, provided they are not able to secure a suitable substitute.

It was further decided by the alliance that no entrance fee will be charged to the camp ground on Sunday. Instead of this a silver collection will be taken at the main gate.

In the afternoon Rev. H. B. Noble, Woodstock, treasurer of the sinking fund, announced that he had received altogether more than \$130 for the purpose of wiping out the debt. The alliance has purchased the beautiful ten roomed cottage belonging to Mrs. R. A. Jones of Seattle (Wash.), situated near the grounds, and will use it to provide additional accommodation for roomers.

The Missionary Society held a meeting in the afternoon, but have not yet reported. The camp meetings at Beulah commenced Sunday next. Rev. Dr. Cardinane and Rev. Mr. Gates are expected on the 9th and they will remain at Beulah close of the meetings on the 17th. The weather here is delightful, the people are beginning to arrive in large numbers and very large attendance is expected during the meetings. Lieutenant F. H. Grass preached in the tabernacle last night.
