### Battering at French Line

London, July 9.—Evidently the German high command has decided that France is the weakest link in the allied chain, and is determined to concentrate the most powerful of its army. The British have been steadily free from enemy attacks recently, and it appears that the Germans have about given up hope of making any very remarkable gains against the British, who are just now in splendid condition and ready for any offensive the Kaiser's chiefs may launch. At the same time the Germans have been hitting sharply on the French front, and today's news is no exception. So far, the Teuton attacks have been fruitless, but the crown prince is stubbornly hammering away.

Early yesterday morning the Germans made four separate and simultaneous attacks launched at a number of points along the Alsace. At several places the French had to give ground before the onrush of the enemy masses, but generally they maintained their positions.

Around Froimont farm the Germans pierced the French first line and held their gains for several hours until the battle turned in France's favor. The net result of the enemy's attack is practically nil. He gained nothing, and on the other hand suffered terrible losses.

Amsterdam, July 9.—The Austrian cabinet, the Lokal Anzeiger of Berlin says, has decided to resign. A new ministry, it added, already is in course of formation.

The present Austrian cabinet, under the premiership of Dr. von Zeidler, has been in office but two weeks, having been formed on June 24. It succeeded the cabinet of Count Clam-Martinic, which had a stormy career of but six months.

Amsterdam, July 9.—The main committee of the Reichstag today continued its confidential discussion of internal and external political affairs. Dr. von Bethmann-Hollweg, the imperial chancellor, the secretaries of state and many members of the Bundestag attended the meeting.

Copenhagen, July 9.—A sharply censored Berlin despatch says that the emperor at yesterday's audience expressed confidence in the imperial chancellor and approved Dr. von Bethmann-Hollweg's course in opposing the Reichstag demand to commit Germany to peace without annexations or indemnities.

The Berlin Tageblatt says that the all-day conferences of the Reichstag middle parties and moderate Socialists brought the parties nearer to an agreement regarding the questions of peace terms and internal reforms.

Grand Headquarters of the French Army in France, July 8.—(By the Associated Press).—The most daring raid yet carried out against the German machine gun works at Essen was recounted to a staff correspondent of the Associated Press today by Sergt. Maxim E. Gallois, who defied all the German anti-aircraft defenses and bombarded the heart of the German armament producing factories with high explosives, crossed the German front line twice, flew over many Rhenish cities and reached home scathless.

The whole flight lasted seven hours, during which the daring French aviator was guided only by the moon and stars and the compass, as the voyage was made in the darkest hours of the night, the destination being reached exactly according to plans. Sergt. Gallois narrated his story in the simplest manner. He said:

### Three Priests Celebrate 25th Anniversary

Rev. A. J. O'Neill, Rev. J. J. Ryan and Rev. A. L'Archeveue Were Ordained at Same Time

Twenty-five years ago three young students who had just completed their theological studies at the Grand Seminary, Quebec, were ordained to the priesthood at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, by the late Bishop Sweeney. In the past quarter of a century the trio have worked zealously in the diocese of St. John and on July 16 of this year they will observe the silver jubilee of their ordination. The three priests are well known throughout New Brunswick, two of them, in particular, being well known in the city of St. John. They are Rev. A. J. O'Neill, M.A., of St. Joachim's church, Silver Falls; Rev. J. J. Ryan, M.A., of St. Gertrude's church, Woodstock (N. B.); and Rev. A. L'Archeveue, of St. Andrew's (N. B.). Both Father O'Neill and Father Ryan were at one time stationed at St. John. The ceremony of ordination took place in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception at 2 o'clock on the morning of July 16, 1892, the late Bishop John Sweeney being the ordinator. The three young priests had completed their classical courses at St. Joseph's College, Montserrat, and after that went to the Grand Seminary, Quebec, where they took their theological studies and it is worthy of note that all made high marks there. Father O'Neill, after his ordination, was stationed at the Cathedral for several years, and was then transferred to the pastorate of St. Joachim's church, Silver Falls, where he has since been stationed. Father Ryan is a native of the city and has attained considerable note as a speaker and a literature many contributions from his pen having appeared in literary journals. Father Ryan is a native of the old country and came to Canada at an early age. He said his first mass in the Church of the Assumption, West St. John, on the day following his ordination and after a short time as curate at Milltown (N. B.), he took up his duties at St. John.
