AWAY TO EUROPE

St. John Young Ladies on a

Two Months' Tour—Ox-

ford Study Included.

Miss Northrup, teacher of domestic

science in the city schools, accompanied

by her niece, Miss Marjorie Northrup,

daughter of Isaac H. Northrup, will leave

tomorrow afternoon for Montreal

where they will sail on July 3 on the

steamship Scotian on a two months'

tour of Great Britain and the battlefields

of France and Flanders. Miss White-

head, court stenographer, of this city,

will also make the trip, and there will

be several from other parts of New

Brunswick.

The tour will be under the auspices of

the Overseas Education League and

the party will comprise some 300 teach-

ers and others from Canada. Major Ney

is honorary organizer.

Included in the itinerary is a visit to

Oxford University, where the travelers

will be accorded the privilege of partici-

pating in a course of instruction in

under-graduates. The same courtesy

will be extended to them by the univer-
